



Environmental Book

Label the Beauty in Nature

Beginner: Go for a walk around your community and collect, draw, or trace environmental objects to create a book.

[Tip]: Talk about why you picked these objects!

Intermediate: Go for a walk around your community and collect, draw, or trace environmental objects to create a book, organize the objects in alphabetical order!

[Tip]: For example, trace an acorn for A, collect bark for B, and draw a cloud for C.

Experienced: Go for a walk around your community and collect, draw, or trace environmental objects to create a book label for each object that you collect.

[Tip]: Trace and label different types of leaves, bark, or trees!

Why is this important? Collecting natural objects links sensory experiences with words, which helps foster language skills.
