



Sporty Shapes Go Shapes Go More!

Beginner: Using physical equipment at your local school, community centre, or at home, talk about the names 3-D objects.

[Tip]: Hockey pucks are short cylinders, baseball bats are long cylinders, and a soccer ball is a sphere.

Intermediate: Using pictures, trace and name the shapes of sports equipment and playing fields. **[Tip]:** Using pictures, trace and name the shapes of sports equipment and playing fields.

Experienced: Using sports fields and equipment talk about how many different shapres you can see within each.

[Tip]: A soccer ball has 12 pentagons and 20 hexagons on it.

Why is this important? Learning the name of shapes helps children describe 2 and 3 dimensional objects.
