Sharing Rocks!

Beginner: Collect and decorate rocks to leave around your community.

[Tip]: Use paint and markers to decorate your rocks.

Intermediate: Decorate rocks with positive messages and encourage your child to write simple words like "Joy" or symbols like hearts and peace signs.

[Tip]: Encourage your child to write neatly.

Experienced: Come up with simple phrases as a family that could help brighten someone's day. **[Tip]:** Help your child spell difficult words by sounding them out.

Why is this important? Creating positive messages to share with our community is a great way to spread joy while practicing early writing and fine motor skills.
