Counting With Pictures

Beginner: Make a book of numbers that correspond to pictures of everyday items.

[Tip]: Start with numbers 1-5. For 4, draw 4 apples.

Intermediate: Expand your number book to numbers 6-20.

[Tip]: You may need bigger pages for the larger numbers.

Experienced: Expand your number book to numbers 21-100.

[Tip]: You may need bigger pages for the larger numbers.

[Brief] Why? Recognizing numbers as a part of everyday life prepares children for learning math concepts.

[Detailed] Why? Students who visualize word problems are more likely to solve complex math problems accurately.
