



H is for Hockey

Rink Reading!

Beginner: Find all the letter H's around. Say the H sound. Make an H with your hands.

[Tip]: The letter H could be at the beginning, middle or end of a word.

Intermediate: Name objects starting with the letter H. Practice letter sounds.

[Tip]: hockey, head, helmet, hat, hand, handshake, home, heel, hair, high-sticking, hat-trick

Experienced: Search for printed words around the rink. Practice letter sounds.

[Tip]: "I spy a word that starts with H." Look for printed words around you.

[Brief] Why? Naming letters and knowing their sounds helps with learning to read.

[Detailed] Why? Letter and sound awareness are important for literacy development.
