



Letter Bingo

Let's Find Letters!

Beginner: Make a bingo sheet using the letters in your child's name.

[Tip]: Call out letters one at a time, then cover each one with a small object (stones, coins, buttons, candy).

Intermediate: Make a bingo sheet using all the letters of the alphabet.

[Tip]: Call out letter or letter sounds one at a time, then cover each one with a small object (stones, coins, buttons, candy).

Experienced: Make several bingo sheets using different letter combinations.

[Tip]: Take turns being the bingo caller, using letter combination sounds.

Why is this important? Letter knowledge is an important foundation for reading.
