



Words that Rhyme With . . .

Come Rhyme with Me

Beginner: Say or sing rhyming words.

[Tip]: Llamas can wear pajamas. Bears like to eat pears.

Intermediate: Help your child create simple shape poems with words or short phrases.

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Experienced: Write/draw rhyming words on paper and turn upside down to play a memory rhyming game.

[Tip]: Turn over two at a time to see if they rhyme; ex. boat & goat.

Why is this important? Rhyming helps to see word and sound patterns, which is important for reading exploration.
